## Summary of Open Space in Pinellas County

A summary of Pinellas County's managed open space areas is shown in **Table 9**. In total, there are almost 20,000 acres of open space provided by the County. This is an impressive number for an urbanized county of such a small geographic size. The numbers reflect an ongoing genuine commitment toward recreational, environmental and aesthetic quality.
